



KIDS' RIGHTS

Persons receiving services from Family & Children's Services (FCS) shall enjoy all rights, benefits and privileges guaranteed by the laws and constitutions of the State of Oklahoma and the United States of America including the Substance Abuse Client's Bill of Rights.

Each client served by FCS can expect:

- You will be treated nicely.
- You will be seen in a safe, clean place.
- You will not be talked to or touched in a way that is hurtful.
- You will be treated as nicely as everyone else.
- You may have your family be a part of your therapy.
- You may talk about what you would like to happen in therapy.
- What you tell your counselor is private between the two of you subject to certain legal exceptions.
- You may say "no" to your counselor/case manager.
- You can talk about your religion or spiritual feelings.
- You may ask to talk to someone else if you don't agree with your counselor/case manager.
- You may tell someone if you are not treated nicely.
- You will not get in trouble for doing what your rights say you can do.
- Your counselor will talk with you in a language you understand.
